# **Latest Air Show Notes**

### 2022 Edmonton International Air Show by Tom Sand



The Edmonton International The Edmonton International Air Show is transitioning from being an air display to

an Aerospace, Transportation, and Logistics Exposition that showcases and demonstrates aerospace technologies and capabilities that foster aerospace associated economic development. The intent of the 2022 Edmonton International Air Show (August 13th and 14th at Villeneuve Airport) is to Inspire, Educate, Engage and Entertain the next generation of Aerospace Professionals. The 2022 Airshow is in the late stages of planning with several exciting participants confirmed. Subject to operational availability of some aircraft it is shaping up to be a memorable experience with a little something for everyone.

The planned line-up for the 2022 Alberta International Airshow will Inspire, Educate, Engage and Entertain by honouring past achievements and showcasing current and emerging aerospace technologies and capabilities using a combination of military, commercial, and recreational fixed and rotary wing aircraft past, present and developing. Flying and static displays will be provided by a broad range of aircraft from the RCAF, USAF, USN and US Army as well as a variety of civilian aircraft. Participants will be announced as they are confirmed.



The Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) Snowbirds 431 Air Demonstration Squadron has confirmed their participation in the 2022 Airshow. They are scheduled to arrive a few days prior to the Airshow and some

media opportunities involving the Snowbird air and ground crews are being planned. The CF parachute demonstration team the SkyHawks has also confirmed their participation in the 2022 Airshow.

We are pleased to welcome back the Watson Brothers Yellow Thunder Formation Aerobatic Team from Ponoka. Yellow Thunder is a two-plane, altitude-unrestricted formation



aerobatic demonstration team flying a Harvard Mk4 and Mk IIB. The Harvard Mk 4, CCF 4-34, was built by the Canadian Car & Foundry company in Thunder Bay and rolled off the production line in 1952. The Mk IIB Harvard was a United Kingdom contribution to the BCATP, and was built for the RCAF in Inglewood, California in 1942. The RCAF assigned this Harvard with s/n 3776 where it served as an advanced flight trainer preparing students to be competent in the skills required as a fighter pilot.



The participation of the Northern Stars Aeroteam, a three-plane Pitts Special formation aerobatics display team is confirmed. The aircraft are owned and operated by three RCAF veterans.

The Airshow is excited to welcome the USAF Academy Glider Aerobatic Demonstration Team. The Academy's aerobatics team uses the TG-16A Glider, a two-seat, engine-less glider. The glider is towed to altitude before being released. The team will perform advanced aerobatic maneuvers that demonstrate the capabilities of the aircraft.

Flying displays of a broad range of general aviation fixed and rotary wing aircraft including Undaunted Airshows Orca Flight. Orca Flight is a dynamic high energy 2-ship aerobatic formation team from the US from the Pacific Northwest flying an RV7 and RV 8 Fastback aircraft.

The Airshow will also be planning to welcome some cutting-edge Canadian-based civilian Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV), also referred to as drones. We are hoping to have some military UAVs to keep them company.

The planned line-up of flying and static military aircraft includes some of the following operational aircraft types: Transport, Trainer, Tactical Aviation (helicopters), Search and Rescue, Maritime Aviation, Bomber, and Fighter. Details will be announced as they are confirmed.

The 2022 Airshow is in the late stages of planning with a little over a month before execution it is shaping up to be an exciting, inspirational, entertaining, educational and experience for all ages.

### **Air Cadet Museum**

Royal Canadian Air Cadet Museum Display Design Update.

MI Concept + Design Incorporated is supporting, at no cost, the Royal Canadian Air Cadet Museum in our efforts to inform, promote and encourage public awareness of the Air Cadet Program across Canada. Embedded in the Cadet's history, established in 1941, is a connected history of those who fought in the Second World War to the aviation sector today.

The displays will honour the significance of the intersecting histories while encouraging youth to make a difference in their lives and community through the Air Cadet program.

Work continues with the Manitoba Provincial Committee to create a display in the Royal Aviation Museum of Western Canada in Winnipeg.

The Alberta Provincial Committee is to create a display in the Bomber Command Museum of Canada in Nanton and refresh the display in the Alberta Aviation Museum in Edmonton.



National Design for post Second World War Program Display at the Alberta Aviation Museum

The New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island and Saskatchewan Provincial Committees are actively exploring the creation of Air Cadet displays/exhibits at appropriate locations in those provinces.

- a.) The display at the Royal Aviation Museum of Western Canada will highlight the Air Cadet Gliding Program and Manitoba Squadrons. Proposed display will include a glider.
- b.) The display at the Alberta Aviation Museum will be in two parts. One display on the east wall of the event hall will focus on the period 1941 to 1945 and will be similar to the Bomber Command Museum of Canada Air Cadet display in Nanton. Close to the entrance in the walkway between the AAM and the event hall, the other display will focus on the modern Air Cadet Pro-

gram and the Air Cadet Squadrons north of Calgary, especially those in Edmonton and surrounding area.

Target date for final design was June 30th. The target date for the official unveiling is yet to be determined but notionally planned during the 2022 Battle of Britain week.

c.) The display at the Bomber Command Museum of Canada (BCMC) will cover the period 1941 to 1945 and will focus on program origins and Air Cadets who joined the RCAF and were posted to Bomber Command Squadrons. Some names may even be on the BCMC Memorial Wall.

BCMC is highlighting southern Alberta Squadrons, especially 195 (Nanton) and 187 (Foothills) Squadrons.

Continuing to work with 187 (Foothills) Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadron who are encouraging current Air Cadets to become involved in the project to help research names of former Air Cadets who joined the RCAF and were posted to Bomber Command Squadrons. Target date for final design was May 31st and target date for official unveiling is TBD during the 2022 Battle of Britain week.

The MI Concept + Design team has created three series of design options for displays/exhibits based on space available and budgets. The designs can serve a myriad of applications and environments. The "Kit of Parts" approach allow for modular designs that can be built out according to the space available. The Royal Canadian Air Cadet Museum's vision for new and engaging exhibits will be recognizable no matter the location. The MI Concept + Design team will also assist in developing the graphic/information panels as

required. Once designs are finalized and approved,

they will be implemented.

- a.) The displays at the Alberta Aviation Museum in Edmonton in its early design phase. The displays will be based on using the current cabinetry and have the cabinets wrapped with graphics if that is within budget. Painting them satin black is the back-up. See notional design below.
- b.) The display at the Bomber Command Museum of Canada in Nanton will be based on using the current cabinetry and have the cabinets wrapped with graphics if that is within budget. Painting them satin black.


