Speaker Series - Tac Hel Deployments in Iraq and Mali; A Pilot Perspective



After our Saturday, May 11 meeting this year, we were honoured to have **Captain Elizabeth** "**Liz" Williams**, a pilot with 408 Tac Hel Squadron, as our guest speaker for our Speaker Series.

Liz spoke with us primarily about two missions she had recently been deployed on in Iraq and in Mali. In late 2017, she was deployed as an Aircraft Commander to Iraq on OP IM-PACT, where she was also the Flight Safety Officer and Electronic Warfare Officer. In 2018-2019, she deployed to Gao, Mali as part of Op PRESENCE in the position of Deputy Operations Officer. In Mali, she was also employed as an Aviation Mission Commander and Electronic Warfare Officer. Liz provided her perspectives on the deployments, including the

pre-deployment training and a bit on post-deployment. She also made mention of her experiences as woman in the Forces today. It was refreshing to hear her talk about those experiences as positive and normalized.

After her presentation she stayed to talk to the audience and took many questions. She thoroughly impressed all of us and we are glad to know she flies for us in the RCAF. Sic itur ad astra!

The Air Cadet Museum - An Update

A museum is a non-profit making, permanent institution in the service of society and of its development, and open to the public, which acquires, conserves, researches, communicates and exhibits for purposes of study, education and enjoyment, material evidence of people and their environment (July 6, 2001, International Council of Museums).

The Air Cadet Museum and Archives is undergoing renewal. The Air Cadet story is a national one and the concept is to tell the national story in a regional or provincial manner by forming a partnership between

the Royal Canadian Air Force Association (RCAFA) nationally, the Air Cadet League of Canada (ACLC), and the Canadian Aeronautical Preservation Association (CAPA). As part of this change the Air cadet Museum display at the Alberta Aviation Museum will be renewed. It is envisaged that the focus will be on the Air Cadet story in Edmonton and Alberta as part of the national story.

Through CAPA the plan would be to establish a historical Air Cadet presence in every Air Museum and Aviation Heritage sites in Canada...

It is proposed that the Air Cadet League of Canada will become the parent organization of the Air Cadet Museum and Archives with the possibility of changing the name to the Royal Canadian Air Cadet Museum of Canada. Through CAPA the plan would be to establish a historical Air Cadet presence in every Air Museum and Aviation Heritage sites in Canada where they currently do not exist. These displays would be supported by the host museum or heritage site, the ACLC Provincial Committees and Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadrons in the region. Initial discussions with CAPA and the ACLC nationally indicate that both



are very receptive to and supportive of the idea. It is also envisaged that the RCAFA may be able to provide support locally to regional and/or provin-

cial Air Cadet museum displays. A formal proposal will be made to CAPA, the ACLC and the RCAFA nationally in the not-too-distant future.



To go along with the renewed is an updated mission, vision and strategic goals.

Proposed Mission

To preserve, interpret and present to the public the continuing history of the Royal Canadian Air Cadets, to promote learning about our country's premier youth development program.

Proposed Vision

To be the authoritative source for information on the history of the Canadian Air Cadet program distinguished by the lasting and positive impact of the Royal Canadian Air Cadet program.

Strategic Goals

- Be the Repository of Canadian Air Cadet History and a resource for researcher and historians; and
- Tell the story of the Royal Canadian Air Cadets and promote and encourage public awareness of the Air Cadet Program/Movement by collecting, preserving and displaying Air Cadet artifacts and interpret their significance.

There is a significant amount of work to be done in the renewal process. It is anticipated that it will take approximately 18 months to get all the pieces in place to move forward. 






















Governor General of Canada Sovereign Medal for Volunteers

Who can remember the Friday Seafood smorgs with people lined up outside to get in. There was an outdoor swimming pool as well as tennis courts.
